

# Awards Health, Safety & Wellbeing Award 2023

This Award recognises projects and policy initiatives or strategies that have significantly contributed to casualty reduction and improved safety for all transport users, including pedestrians, and/or transport workers. Its aim is to identify, share and celebrate good practice. The award is also an opportunity to demonstrate good industry practice, novel or innovative responses to safety critical operations whether it is policy or practice or through design/construction. The award recognises the impact of all three elements of health, safety and wellbeing as providing improvements and enhancements to the lives of the public and workers.

Entries must clearly explain how the submission meets the criteria specified.

# a) Description: How does this entry meet the award description? (Max 250 Words) (10 Points)

A summary explaining why this project/product/strategy/initiative meets the description for this award.

## b) Solution: Why and how was this solution identified?

(Max 300 Words) (20 Points)

Please explain why and how this solution was identified.

The judges will reward applications that can demonstrate:

- A clear definition of the outcome you were trying to achieve and why
- A logical explanation of why this option was chosen
- Evidence that you ensured that all the relevant stakeholders have bought into this solution

#### c) Delivery: How has this work been delivered?

(Max 250 Words) (15 Points)

Please describe the planning, design and delivery process you have used to execute this work. The judges are particularly interested in how challenges and opportunities have been identified and addressed.

#### d) Results: What have been the results?

(Max 250 Words) (15 Points)

Please describe the results of your work.

The judges will reward applications that can demonstrate:

- If and how you have delivered the outcome you were trying to achieve
- How you have performed against time, cost, quality, carbon emission, social value, and any other metrics relevant that were set for this work

## e) Alignment: to CIHT Strategy

(Max 200 Words) (10 Points)

Judges will award additional marks to applications that can demonstrate a contribution to CIHT's strategic objectives:

- Carbon Action: Measurable reductions or elimination of greenhouse gas emissions
- Equality, Diversity & Inclusion: Clear demonstration of well-considered EDI practices in either the project or organisation
- Professionalism: Clear contribution to increasing professionalism in the transport sector

Winners will be announced at the CIHT Cymru Wales Awards Dinner at the Kinmel Hotel in Abergele on the evening of Friday 24 November 2023 and details published through a variety of media platforms.
